


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GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2018-2019

In the academic year 2018-2019, the Grievance Redressal Cell of K.E. College Mannanam, chaired by Dr. Antony Thomas, Principal, and consisting of key members including Fr. Joby Joseph, Vice Principal, Ms. Jesline Maaria Mamen, Dr. Vinu J Joseph, Dr. Dhanya Joseph, Dr. Anju Augustine, Ms. Deepa Mary Joseph, and Ms. Anitta P Manuel, addressed several pressing concerns raised by students and staff. The first meeting of the year, held on July 10, 2018, tackled infrastructural issues such as improving car parking facilities for staff and students, developing infrastructure for a new college canteen, and advancing the green campus initiative.

In response to the concerns discussed, a second meeting was convened during the second semester, focusing on student grievances. This meeting, which proceeded after all formalities were addressed, centered on several issues including the adequacy of computer facilities in the computer room, the need for additional fans and lights in classrooms, and complaints regarding breakage fees in the computer lab. The committee decided on several resolutions to address these problems: purchasing additional computers to enhance the computer lab's capabilities, installing more fans and lights to improve classroom comfort, and revising the collection of lab dues to be done on an individual basis to ensure fairness and transparency.

Throughout the year, the Grievance Redressal Cell demonstrated a commitment to improving both the academic environment and student satisfaction at K.E. College Mannanam. The resolutions adopted reflected a proactive approach to addressing the concerns of students and staff, emphasizing the college's dedication to creating a more efficient and supportive educational atmosphere












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GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020

The Grievance Redressal Cell of KE College Mannanam held its first meeting for the academic year 2019-2020 on June 20, 2019, in conjunction with the Internal Complaints Cell. The meeting, attended by Dr. Antony Thomas (Principal), Fr. Joby Joseph Mukalel, Fr. Johnson Joseph, Dr. Jollyamma Mathew, Dr. Brigit Paul, Prof. Stancy V. Sebastian, Dr. Smitha S., and Dr. Sindhu E. S, addressed student requests for a garden near the store and campus beautification. The committee discussed the feasibility of these proposals, focusing on enhancing campus amenities and aesthetics.

A follow-up meeting was held on January 15, 2020, where the committee reviewed additional student concerns, including the absence of a sports hostel and gymnasium, and requests for park beautification near the college canteen. The committee, with all members present, resolved to recommend to the college management the establishment of a new sports hostel, gym, and garden to address these issues.

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GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2020-2021

The Grievance Redressal Committee, comprising Dr. Brigit Paul (Principal), Fr. Dr. Xavier C.S., Prof. Stancy V. Sebastian, Dr. Jollyamma Mathew, and Ms. Sona Santy (III DC B.A. English Student), convened its first meeting on June 24, 2020. The primary agenda was to address student grievances related to online classes and improper scheduling. The committee resolved to recommend to the college council the correction of scheduling issues and to address problems associated with online classes. It was decided that online classes would be scheduled from 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM, with a reduction in class duration and the implementation of a regular feedback system from students to enhance the overall learning experience.

In the second meeting, held on September 14, 2020, the committee tackled issues concerning library access and online examinations. The committee agreed to grant students regular access to the library and decided to conduct offline examinations to better meet student needs. All committee members were present at this meeting, and the resolutions aimed to improve student support and academic integrity by addressing these key concerns effectively.








The Grievance Redressal Committee, led by Fr. Dr. Xavier C.S. (Principal) and including members Joycekutty Joseph, Prof. Stancy V. Sebastian, Dr. Jollyamma Mathew, and Ms. Nimisha Salin (II DC B.A. Student), convened its first meeting on July 11, 2021. The agenda addressed several student complaints, including the need for a gymnasium, repairs to the water cooler, the establishment of a career and placement cell, and issues related to online classes. The committee decided to initiate the creation of a placement cell and address the concerns regarding online classes by scheduling a staff meeting to discuss and resolve these issues.

The second meeting took place on November 22, 2021, with all members present. Major complaints discussed included frequent power supply failures, the need for a badminton court, inadequate internet access in the college library, the necessity for an improved examination hall, and issues with the college uniform. The committee resolved to request the college management to ensure an uninterrupted power supply, establish a Wi-Fi system across the campus, and implement a uniform policy starting from the next academic year.

Throughout the year, the Grievance Redressal Committee actively addressed student concerns by proposing practical solutions and ensuring that necessary improvements were planned and executed. On august 3rd 2022, a general orientation seminar was organised by the Grievance Redressal Committee on Discipline and Academic Excellence . The resource person for the programme was Dr. Angel Thomas, an eminent clinical psychologist from Marsleeva Medicity Pala. These efforts reflect the committee's commitment to enhancing the academic and campus experience by tackling infrastructure and facility issues effectively.


The Grievance Redressal Committee for the academic year 2022-2023, chaired by Prof. Dr. Ison V. Vanchipurackal (Principal) and including Dr. Joycekutty Joseph and Dr. Jollyamma Mathews, convened its first meeting on June 22, 2022. This initial meeting addressed several student concerns, including requests for the installation of a hot water facility and adjustments to the uniform policy to ensure proper sizing. The committee acknowledged the importance of these issues for student comfort and resolved to implement the installation of a hot water facility. Additionally, it was decided to review and modify the uniform policy to better accommodate students' needs regarding fit, ensuring that all students could be provided with appropriately sized uniforms.

The committee's second meeting was held on October 28, 2022, and focused on addressing issues related to campus amenities. During this session, complaints were raised about malfunctioning vending machines and the need for repairs to the sanitary napkin incinerator. The committee decided to take immediate action by coordinating with the maintenance department to service and repair the vending machines and the incinerator. These measures were aimed at improving the availability of refreshments and maintaining sanitary conditions on campus, thus addressing the practical needs of students effectively.

The final meeting of the academic year took place on February 2, 2023. At this meeting, the committee revisited concerns about the uniforms, specifically addressing complaints about the inability to wear overcoats during the colder months of February and March. Additionally, issues with the drinking water supply were discussed. The committee resolved to adjust the uniform policy to allow for overcoats during the colder months and to enhance the drinking water supply across the campus. These decisions were made to ensure that students had appropriate clothing for varying weather conditions and reliable access to drinking water, thereby improving overall student satisfaction and comfort.












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ANTI-RAGGING CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2018-2019




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INTERNAL COMPLAINTS CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022




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INTERNAL COMPLAINTS CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2022-2023
