MULTI DISCIPLINARY/INTER DISCIPLINARY COURSES

In response to the NEP, the College has introduced several interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary programs that blend multiple fields of study which encourages the integration of knowledge across disciplines. University curriculum promotes interdisciplinary education, through Open Courses in the fifth semester for undergraduates and the students have the flexibility to choose from a range of courses across all disciplines. Environmental Studies and Human Rights is offered as a mandatory course for all U.G programmes. These courses are designed to provide students with a broader perspective and equip them with diverse skills that are applicable across various sectors. 







• Invited Talk on 'Wonderful World of Vedic Mathematics'



OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION

The implementation of Outcome-Based Education at the College from the 2022 P.G batch onwards marks a significant step towards aligning with the New Education Policy and enhancing the overall educational experience of students. This strategic shift reflects the college's commitment to adopting progressive educational practices that focus on achieving specific learning outcomes and preparing students for real-world challenges.

The curriculum for all P.G programs has been designed by the University to incorporate Outcome-Based Education principles. Each course now has clearly defined Course Outcomes (COs) that are aligned with the broader Program Outcomes (POs) and Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs). These outcomes are designed to ensure that students not only acquire theoretical knowledge but also develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and practical skills.

To ensure the successful implementation of OBE, the college has conducted several faculty development programs, including the webinar on Outcome Mapping. An online faculty development programme on Outcome Mapping was organized by the IQAC on the Google Meet platform on May 25, 2023 to train faculty members on the Outcome Mapping process



and its implementation in the college. The session aimed to enhance the faculty's ability to evaluate course attainment and align course outcomes with program outcomes. The resource person, Mr. Firoz M.A, CEO and Founder of Embase Prosuit Pvt. Ltd., MGU Innovation Foundation, Kottayam, commended the progress of the outcome mapping process in the college using the Embase outcome mapping module and explained the latest updates in the module. Forty-six faculty members actively participated in the webinar and are now capable of evaluating course attainment and aligning course outcome with programme outcomes.

The assessment methods have been revised to align with the OBE framework. Both formative and summative assessments are now designed to measure the extent to which students have achieved the intended learning outcomes. Continuous evaluation processes are in place to monitor and improve student performance throughout the academic year. The college has adopted the Embase Outcome Mapping module to systematically track and evaluate the attainment of course and program outcomes. This tool helps in identifying gaps in the learning process and making necessary adjustments to ensure that all outcomes are met.

First year degree students of the college will be registered under the Academic Performance and Attendance Register (APAAR) ID which enable students to utilize the benefits of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) such as accumulate and transfer credit across different institutions avail flexibility in academic progression and facilitate interdisciplinary learning This will contribute significantly to improving the quality of higher education and helpi students take full advantage of the flexibility that NEP 2020 offers.

The students of Chemistry Department of the College have done a detailed study of the Phytochemistry of some of our medicinal plants found around our vicinity and which are found commonly in Kerala.








Skill Development Programme on "Basic Proficiency Course in English"








Entrepreneurship Training program on Fabric Choker in Junk Jewellery & Frock Design Draping









Workshop on book binding








> Young Innovators Programme










SEMINAR/WEBINARS CONDUCTED

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


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Fostering Inclusive and Equal Opportunity




• Electoral Literacy Activities
