



WORLD POPULATION DAY






FREEDOM WALL PAINTING




INTERNATIONAL DAY OF DEMOCRACY

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GANDHI JAYANTHI CELEBRATIONS










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LEGALSERVICEDAY


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CONSTITUTION DAY

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BUDGET ANALYSIS



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



INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE DAY




NAGASAKI DAY




INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF TRUST AND PEACE

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
POSTER DESIGNING COMPETITION

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




NATIONAL CONSTITUTION DAY

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STATE LEVEL WEBINAR ON 'TRENDS IN ACADEMIC PLAGIARISM'



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
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KARGILVIJAYDIWAS

VOTERS ID ENROLLMENT CAMPAIGN




GANDHI SMRITI AND MARTYRS' DAY






ELECTIONAWARENESSPROGRAM (SVEEP)








ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION


COVID -19 AWARENESS VIDEO
