




#### **AWAKE 2021**








# **AWAKE 2020**

Kuriakose Elias College, Mannanam stands as a beacon of support and empowerment and overall well-being for children and the elderly alike. One of the college's cornerstone initiatives is the Talir Scholarship Program, which provides crucial financial assistance and scholarships to economically disadvantaged students. This program is more than just financial aid; it offers a comprehensive support system that includes educational kits, free tuition services, counselling, and recognition for academic excellence. By alleviating financial barriers, the college ensures that deserving students have the opportunity to pursue higher education, thus opening doors to a brighter future. The college also runs "Kalikoottam," a dynamic gathering held every second Saturday, designed to equip children with essential life skills. Through skill development classes, personality development sessions, vocational training, and professional career guidance, the program aims to nurture well-rounded individuals prepared for future challenges. The college has actively conducted sessions and street plays on critical legislation such as the Child Labor (Prohibition and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2016, and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses (POCSO) Act, targeting various schools to ensure that students are informed and safeguarded. To cultivate a culture of reading and learning, the college has established libraries at different schools and set up a Children's Club in the Nalpathimala region. The college also celebrates Children's Day with enthusiasm and organizes drug abuse prevention programs across several schools. Two Community Learning Centers in adopted villages support continuing education, reinforcing the institution's commitment to lifelong learning.

The college's initiatives extend beyond children, offering comprehensive care and support for the elderly. Through counselling, palliative care, and medical aid, K.E. College addresses the critical needs of senior citizens. Legal assistance is provided to tackle issues such as housing, consumer fraud, elder abuse, social security, and age discrimination, ensuring that the elderly are protected and supported. The Elder's Club at Nalpathimala, under the Athirampuzha Panchayat, fosters community support by providing a social and recreational platform for senior citizens. In collaboration with Ahalya Eye Hospital, the college organised a free eye testing and cataract surgery diagnosis camp, addressing the growing need for elderly medical support. Additionally, an elderly helpline was introduced to offer immediate assistance and healthcare guidance, ensuring that senior citizens have access to the support they need. K.E. College also champions lifelong learning for older adults through various educational opportunities, cultural activities, and social events.

# FORMATION OF ELDER'S CLUB AND CHILDREN'S CLUB AT NALPATHIMALA REGION




#### AWARENESS CLASS ON ADDICTION AT 5 SCHOOLS

successfully fostered greater awareness among the students, equipping them with the knowledge to make informed decisions and resist the pressures of drug use.














#### **COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER**















#### VISIT TO SREE KRISHNA VILASAM GOVT. LP SCHOOL, KAIPPUZHA


### **BOOK DONATION DRIVE**

#### **DAY 1**

He interacted with the children and discussed the environmental issues, their causes and how to prevent them, followed by a group discussion within the groups. 

#### WORLD DAY AGAINST CHILD LABOUR



#### WEBINAR ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING






#### **INTERNATIONAL DAY OF GIRL CHILD**

# 'ASHA DEEP'

Health and Awareness Drives for Marginalized







To significantly enhance the well-being of marginalized communities, a comprehensive series of health and awareness initiatives were launched in the Neendoor and Athirampuzha panchayaths by Kuriakose Elias College, Mannanam under the 'Asha Deep' initiative. These initiatives, designed to address a broad spectrum of health concerns and educational needs, were executed in collaboration with esteemed partners, including CARITAS Hospital, Thellakom, Kottayam. At the heart of these efforts was a free medical camp held at the Neendoor Public Library, offering essential healthcare services to community members who may not have regular access to medical care. The camp was a resounding success, providing attendees with vital health screenings, consultations, and referrals, ensuring that individuals received the care and attention they needed. The partnership with CARITAS Hospital was instrumental in delivering these services, showcasing the power of community collaboration in fostering public health.

Simultaneously, targeted awareness sessions were organized for migrant workers, a group often overlooked in public health and educational initiatives. These sessions covered a wide range of critical topics, including drug abuse prevention, COVID-19 safety protocols, personal hygiene, digital banking, and workers' rights. By addressing these topics, the program aimed to empower migrant workers with the knowledge and tools needed to safeguard their health and well-being in both their personal and professional lives. The distribution of masks during these sessions underscored the ongoing commitment to COVID-19 prevention, providing an added layer of protection for participants.

Cancer awareness was another focal point of the initiative, with the documentary 'Sparsham' serving as a powerful medium to educate the public about this pervasive disease. The film effectively conveyed the importance of early detection and treatment, helping to dispel myths and reduce the stigma associated with cancer. Similarly, the short film 'Avarkoppam' played a crucial role in educating the community about leprosy, a disease that still carries a significant social stigma. Through this film, viewers were given valuable insights into the causes, symptoms, and treatments of leprosy, promoting a more informed and compassionate approach to those affected by the disease. Further supporting the community's health and well-being, a family planning class was conducted at Ambedkar Colony, focusing on reproductive health. This session provided participants with essential information on family planning methods, reproductive rights, and the importance of maternal and child health. By empowering individuals with this knowledge, the program aimed to build a healthier, more informed





community, capable of making decisions that positively impact their lives and future generations.

#### MEDICAL CAMP FOR MARGINALISED IN NEENDOOR GRAMAPANCHAYATH

KEDAS, in hands with CARITAS Hospital, organized a one-day free medical camp for the benefit marginalized community in Neendoor Gramapanchayat on 17th July 2022. The medical camp was conducted at Neendoor Public Library Hall. Its organizing team included Trainee Social Workers of K E College led by Fr. Biju Thomas (Director), and Ms. Sherin K C (Project Coordinator), KEDAS. The medical team consisted of Doctors from General Medicine, Oncology, Orthopaedic and Dental departments of CARITAS Hospital. The teams arrived at the location at 10 am and the programme started with the welcome speech by Ms. Sherin K C (Project Coordinator). The meeting was inaugurated by Mr. Pradeep Kumar (President, Neendoor Grama Panchayat). The meeting was also addressed by Fr. Biju Thomas CMI (Director, KEDAS), and Mrs. Rosamma NJ (CDS Chairperson). Many villagers participated in the camp. Intotal, 50 villagers attended the medical camp and benefitted. After the checkups, many people benefitted from the medicines provided free of cost by CARITAS Hospital. Few of the patients were referred by the doctors for further treatment. The Trainee Social Workers played a vital role in making this camp successful with their dedication to helping people; they directed people in all needy ways.













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#### HEALTH AWARENESS SURVEY AT VIKAS NAGAR

Under the 'Asha Deep' initiative, KEDAS conducted an insightful visit to the Vikas Nagar community to gain an in-depth understanding the diverse aspects of the community, including its geographical, social, economic, political, and cultural dimensions. The visit commenced with a series of house-to-house interactions, which provided with valuable insights into the daily lives and challenges faced by the residents of Vikas Nagar. These interactions were pivotal in identifying the community's unique needs and concerns, allowing the team to tailor their health awareness initiatives more effectively. By engaging directly with the residents, volunteers were able to assess the socio-economic conditions, political dynamics, and cultural practices that influence health behaviours and access to services.

In addition to the home visits, the team also paid a significant visit to the local Anganwadi centre. This centre plays a crucial role in early childhood care and development, as well as in maternal health services. These interactions provided a deeper understanding of the centre's operations, the services offered, and the challenges faced by the staff. The insights gained from this engagement are instrumental in designing effective health awareness programs that address the specific needs of children and pregnant women in the community.











#### VISIT TO FAMILY HEALTH CENTRE ONAMTHURUTHU

As part of the ongoing efforts to deepen their understanding of community health initiatives, the team from KEDAS made a significant visit to the Family Health Centre in Onamthuruthu, located within the Neendoor Gramapanchayath. This visit was a crucial step in reinforcing the commitment to improve public health outcomes in the region, particularly through tailored health awareness drives that address the specific needs of the community. Through these coordinated efforts, KEDAS aims to bridge the gap between healthcare services and the community, ensuring that residents are not only aware of the health resources available to them but are also equipped with the knowledge to make informed health decisions. By fostering a collaborative relationship with





the Family Health Centre and leveraging the insights gained from the visit, KEDAS is committed to creating a healthier, more informed community in Neendoor Gramapanchayath.










#### AWARENESS DRIVE ON INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS DAY

masks were distributed to them, reinforcing the ongoing commitment to their well-being and safety.














#### AWARENESS CLASS ON DIGITAL BANKING TO MGNREGA WORKERS


#### COMMUNITY INTERVENTION PROGRAM FOR CANCER AWARENESS

On November 7, 2020, a community intervention program was organized for the women of the KEDAS-adopted colonies in Kaippuzha village. The program was designed to use information dissemination and awareness spreading as key strategies to address this serious health issue. The initial phase involved gathering contact details of women from the community through respective ward members. A WhatsApp group was then created, connecting members from all five adopted colonies. This group served as a platform for sharing information about the webinar and providing other relevant guidelines. The central theme of the program, "I CAN I WILL: A COMMITMENT TO OVERCOME," emphasized positive actions to combat cancer. The focus was on preventive measures as well as managing the condition holistically if diagnosed. The aim was to instill a message of hope and resilience in overcoming the challenges posed by cancer.

The webinar, held on November 7, 2020, was led by Mr. Kenson Sam Alex, a Medical Social Worker in the Department of Pediatric Hemato-Oncology at St. John's Hospital, Bangalore. His session was highly informative, addressing the concerns of the participants and enriching their knowledge on the subject. The participants appreciated the content-oriented approach, which significantly lowered their concerns and enhanced their understanding of cancer prevention and management.

#### AWARENESS CLASS ON FAMILY PLANNING AT AMBEDKAR COLONY



This initiative was part of a broader effort to educate and empower the community on crucial aspects of family planning and reproductive health, aligning with the global theme of population management and sustainable development. The program was inaugurated by Mrs. Vimalakuttyamma, the President of Neendoor Panchayath. In her inaugural address, Mrs. Vimalakuttyamma emphasized the critical role of family planning in ensuring the health and well-being of families, as well as its significance in promoting economic stability and community development. 






# WORLD LEPROSY DAY- RELEASE OF SHORT FILM 'AVARKOPPAM'



These courses included training in beauty therapy, paper carry bag making, umbrella making, and candle making, each designed to equip participants with practical skills for entrepreneurial ventures.











#### **WOMENS EQUALITY DAY**

On August 26, 2020, the college celebrated Women's Equality Day with a distinctive theme: "Widening the Spectrum of Womanhood." This theme was chosen to emphasise the importance of recognising and affirming the rights of transwomen to be acknowledged and treated as women. In the broader discourse on women's rights, freedom, and equality, the struggles faced by the transwoman community are often overlooked. This oversight perpetuates their ongoing struggle to establish their identity within society. Our observation of Women's Equality Day aimed to address this issue by advocating for a more inclusive approach to gender expression. As a first step, we introduced practical measures that can be adopted in our workplaces and communities to foster inclusivity. This day of observance also included an experimental initiative, where we curated and shared a selection of documentaries and films that depict the challenges faced by transwomen.
